Minutes from last January meeting were approved.

Treasurers Report-- Nothing much to report. General maintenance and checks for those items.

Don discussed that UCA would like to use the fields again with the same agreement they did last year. Brent Lewis is going to work with them on it.

Old Business--

Pony rule 22.

Runners can advance, at their own risk, from 1st base or 2nd base to 3rd base on any pitched ball once it has crossed the plate, but cannot advance from second base to home plate on the same play, unless **the** defense attempts a play on that or another base runner. If the runner scores illegally, they will be called out.

Rule 23

The USSSA rule on courtesy runners for the catcher will be used in all leagues except tee ball. The last batted out can be used as a runner for the catcher that completed the last defensive out for the batting now at bat. Example player #21 caught the last out of the 3rd inning, and reaches bases to lead off the 4th, that last batted out for his team prior to his at bat can be used to run for him.

New – Change courtesy runners to be used for both catchers and pitchers (this would put us in with USSSA rules)

Pony inning limit 2 innings

New rule from Brent

Coach Pitch Article X H

14. Play is dead when: SUPER PEE WEE ONLY - Play is dead when a player enters the pitching circle with both feet and the game ball. At that time any player less than half way to the next base must return to the base from which he came unless forced. If the player is over half way to the next base he may advance to said base. The pitcher will be given a chance to make a play on any base when fielding a batted ball within the circle, OR Play is dead once the lead runner is stopped and the umpire has declared the ball dead and called for time (as in Pony League). BAMBINO ONLY - Play is dead once the lead runner is stopped and the umpire has declared the ball dead and called for time (as in Pony League).

Coach Pitch Article X H

13. On an overthrow to first base (only), all runners may advance one (1) base only, at their own risk. Note: an overthrow is not to be confused with a catching error.

Prep/BR Article X J

6. A one hour and fifty minute (1:50) time limit will apply. If at the end of the last inning played the score is tied and the time limit has run out, the game shall be recorded as a tie. If at the end of seven innings, the score is tied and the time limit has not been reached, the game will continue under international tie-breaking rules until one team is ahead at the end of the inning or the time limit is reached. The international tie-breaking procedure places the last batter to complete his at-bat from the previous inning at 2nd base to start each half-inning. The game proceeds normally in all other aspects. The standard 1:50 game time still applies, no additional game time is added for breaking tie games. Tie games will be recorded as one-half a win and one-half a loss in the standings. Tie games will be considered as final and WILL NOT BE REPLAYED even if determining a single winner could influence the final standings.

6. A one hour and thirty minute (1:30) time limit will apply. If at the end of the last inning played the score is tied and the time limit has run out, 1 extra inning will be played under the international format (described below). If at the end of that extra inning the game is still tied, it shall be recorded as a tie. If at the end of seven innings, the score is tied and the time limit has not been reached, the game will continue under international tie-breaking rules until one team is ahead at the end of the inning or the time limit is reached. The international tie-breaking procedure places the last batter to complete his at-bat from the previous inning at 2nd base to start each half-inning. The game proceeds normally in all other aspects. The standard 1:50 game time still applies, no additional game time is added for breaking tie games. Tie games will be recorded as one-half a win and one-half a loss in the

7. RUN RULE – The game shall be called when one of the teams has a fifteen (15) run lead after 3 innings, a ten (10) run lead after four innings or an eight (8) run lead after five (five) innings. The score at that point will be the official score of the game. In the event of a run rule, if both teams want to continue play, the umpires must remain on the field for one hour and thirty minutes (1:30) minimum from the game start time.

Change to

7. RUN RULE – The game shall be called when one of the teams has **twelve (12) run lead after three (3) innings, or a 8 (eight) run lead after 4 innings.** The score at that point will be the official score of the game. In the event of a run rule, if both teams want to continue play, the umpires must remain on the field for one hour and thirty minutes (1:30) minimum from the game start time.

Proposed a rule to delete the rule about when the season starts and stops.
